988 MENTAL HEALTH HOTLINE

People experiencing a mental health crisis or witnessing a friend or family member in need of mental health support can dial 9-8-8 to reach the

newly launched national Suicide & Crisis Lifeline. Modeled after 911, the new 988 number connects callers to a trained mental health professional in a network of more than 200 local crisis call centers around the country. Currently, almost 90% of people who call get the help they need over the phone. For those who require additional intervention, a crisis counselor will work to connect them with local resources. The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline aims to divert mental health-related calls away from 911, which often results in unnecessary trips to the emergency room or interactions with those who are not trained in mental health response.
